HOME CONFINEMENT PROGRAM

Information Sheet

The Home Confinement Program is also known as “electronic monitoring” or “house arrest.” It is a supervision program that requires you to wear an ankle bracelet and to abide by approved curfews, unless court ordered to remain in the home 24 hours a day.

In order to be supervised on the Home Confinement program, you must meet the following requirements:

Housing/Residency Requirements

- You must live in Orange, Osceola, or Seminole County.
- There must be working electricity.

Phone requirements

- You must have a residential telephone line. Your telephone line must be a standard basic landline; **no cable or digital services are permitted (NO BRIGHTHOUSE, NO VONAGE,...)**.
- The telephone service cannot have any feature, such as Caller I.D., Privacy Manager, Call Waiting, Call Forwarding, Automated Voicemail or any other special features. Contact your telephone company and instruct them to remove all features.
- No telephone lines through a motel or hotel switchboard are accepted.
- Equipment cannot be hooked up through a cordless telephone.

Weapon Requirements

- No weapons may be kept in the home or in the vehicle of the Defendant.

Employment

- If you have a job and want to work while on Home Confinement this will need to be verified. You will be required to submit a letter from your employer on company letterhead confirming your employment, work location and work schedule.
- You will only be permitted to work in the Central Florida area unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

If you are unable to meet these requirements, you will be required to serve your sentence in the Orange County Jail until the requirements are met.

Defendants can be pre-screened to determine eligibility for Home Confinement by reporting to the Central Intake Unit on the 2nd floor of the Corrections Administration Building located at the Jail facility at 33rd Street. Pre-screens are conducted Monday through Friday from 7:30 am - 10:30 am and Monday through Thursday 12:30 pm-2:30pm. Eligibility is based upon a review of the defendant’s criminal history.
